Overview

Sinai Children's Hospital includes a Level III (the highest level of care) neonatal intensive care unit, outpatient pediatric surgery and anesthesiology. A wide range of specialty outpatient pediatric care is available through Sinai Children's Hospital, including gastroenterology, nephrology, allergy, hematology, endocrinology, urology and neurology. The hospital offers a variety of resources such as a HIV/AIDS program.

We utilize intensive case management to identify and eliminate barriers that impact the social well-being and health status of individuals, families and the community.

Sinai Children's Hospital brings together a multidisciplinary pediatric program that provides a continuum of care, including community health education and a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Holy Cross Hospital

Overview

Holy Cross Hospital, a 264-licensed bed community hospital, provides inpatient and outpatient care for a range of services that include medical, surgical, intensive care, emergency, primary care, behavioral health services, including Chicago's first comprehensive crisis stabilization unit, as well as hospice and palliative care services operated by Seasons Hospice. Its Emergency Department delivers comprehensive care for a broad range of critical and urgent medical needs and provides care for approximately 45,000 ED patients each year.

Holy Cross Hospital works closely with area churches, schools, institutions and organizations to build strong, safe and healthy communities. Sponsored by the Sisters of St. Casimir since 1928, Holy Cross Hospital follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Care.

Mount Sinai Hospital

Overview

Mount Sinai Hospital, a 319-licensed bed acute care safety-net, teaching hospital and Level I Adult Trauma Center, provides a wide array of quality medical, surgical, therapeutic, diagnostic and behavioral health services, including crisis stabilization. The Emergency Department provides care to approximately 41,000 ED patients each year. The Labor and Delivery unit and Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit welcomes over 1,600 newborns annually, caring for both high-risk obstetric patients and providing the highest level of care for premature and critically ill newborns. Mount Sinai Hospital trains more than 700 aspiring health care professionals each year through undergraduate, graduate programs, and four GME-accredited residency programs in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, and pharmacy, in addition to four fellowship programs.

- Inpatient and outpatient behavioral health services for adults.
- Advanced imaging technology includes 1.5T MRI, digital mammography, 64-slice CT, Catheter (Cath) Lab.
- One of Chicago’s largest free-standing outpatient child and adolescent behavioral health programs.
- Sinai Interpreter Services and Sinai Deaf Health offer health-related communications 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Schwab Rehabilitation Hospital

Overview

Schwab Rehabilitation, a 102-licensed bed facility, provides comprehensive inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services for adults and children. Schwab offers a unique therapeutic environment featuring six treatment gyms with advanced equipment, private treatment rooms, a warm-water indoor therapeutic pool and an award-winning therapeutic rooftop garden.

Medical Staff

Support Services

- Extended Services Department. Disability resource for hospital staff, patients, and community members to promote positive community reintegration for people with disabilities. This includes resources for accessible housing, transportation, education, employment and recreational opportunities.
- Domestic Violence Program. Supports people facing domestic violence situations.
- Peer Mentoring. Program helps reintegrate individuals back into the community after leaving rehab with new spinal cord injury, brain injury, stroke, and amputee diagnoses program.
- In My Shoes. A peer-led violence prevention program led by former Schwab patients who have sustained violent injuries as victims or perpetrators of street violence. Speakers go into the community and share their personal stories with youth. Youth gain a firsthand look at life with an injury due to violence.

Sinai Urban Health Institute

Overview

Sinai Urban Health Institute (SUHI) conducts health inequities research, delivers community health worker (CHW) training and consultation, develops innovative community health interventions, and provides a broad scope of evaluation services. Currently funded initiatives focus on the social determinants of health, breast health, diabetes prevention and management, lead poisoning prevention, and violence, among others. SUHI works in partnership with community members and organizations to document health inequities and improve wellbeing in some of Chicago's most vulnerable neighborhoods.

SUHI Research

HEALTH EQUITY AND ASSESSMENT RESEARCH

SUHI researchers identify racial and ethnic health disparities, investigate the underlying causes of these inequities, and translate data and knowledge into action. SUHI conducts rigorous, community-engaged needs assessments and develops community improvement plans.

COMMUNITY HEALTH INNOVATIONS

SUHI addresses health inequities with innovative solutions to reduce barriers faced by patients and community residents in accessing and managing their health care. SUHI is nationally recognized for its expertise with the CHW model and in incorporating community perspectives and technology to develop, implement, and evaluate innovative health initiatives.

SUHI Consulting

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER (CHW) CONSULTING

Through the **C**enter for CHW **R**esearch, **O**utcomes, and **W**orkforce **D**evelopment (**CROWD**), SUHI supports health plans, health systems, organizations, and research studies in hiring, training, supervising, and evaluating CHWs.

SUHI EVALUATION SERVICES

SUHI provides training and consultation on evaluation and capacity-building for healthcare systems, private foundations, universities, and community-based organizations. Qualitative and quantitative methods include focus groups, interviews, document review, surveying, and process mapping. SUHI also has expertise in building databases that are customized to end-user need.

A Selection of Key Initiatives

NON-FATAL GUN VIOLENCE (NFGV) RESEARCH AND INTERVENTION

After exploring, evaluating, and documenting the pathway Sinai Chicago NFGV patients follow from the Emergency Department (ED) to inpatient to rehab and home, SUHI published findings¹, which have since informed an initiative integrating CHWs into the ED to screen for social needs and link patients to applicable resources.

RESEARCH ACTIVISM FOR YOUTH (RAY)

RAY empowers youth to create positive change in their communities and their lives by exposing them to health research and advocacy.

HELPING HER LIVE (HHL)

HHL is a breast health awareness and outreach program for women living in Chicago's West and Southwest communities. CHWs educate women on the importance of screening mammograms, and support them in navigating the process from screening to treatment.

PRIMARY PREVENTION OF LEAD EXPOSURE

A predictive model identifies WIC participants living in properties at high risk for lead-based paint hazards for follow-up. CHWs first conduct visual assessments to identify potential lead-based paint exposure, and refer to Chicago Department of Public Health for additional inspections and mitigation, as needed.

FIFTY CITIES RACIAL DISPARITIES

SUHI analyzes life expectancy and mortality data from the 50 largest U.S. cities to identify health disparities and inform action that addresses the root causes of inequities. Findings are valuable to health care providers, public health departments and professionals, and stakeholders interested in creating interventions that address the social determinants of health.

CHICAGO COLLABORATION TO ADVANCE REACH, EQUITY & SYSTEMS TO PREVENT DIABETES (CHICAGO CARES)

SUHI is a key partner on a five year CDC grant to reduce diabetes disparities in Chicago. CROWD CHWs implement the CDC-recognized Diabetes Prevention Program for Chicago residents who have prediabetes to assist them in increasing physical activity and healthy eating practices. SUHI's Evaluation team is evaluating the initiative, focusing on innovative ways to eliminate barriers to participation and retention among high-risk populations as well as the efficacy of tailored communication approaches in supporting enrollment.

SINAI COMMUNITY HEALTH SURVEY 2.0

Sinai Survey 2.0 is one of the largest community-driven face-to-face health surveys ever conducted in Chicago. SUHI developed Sinai Survey 2.0 in collaboration with its Community Advisory Committee to document health across nine Chicago communities; to better understand social factors associated with health-related behaviors, service utilization, and outcomes; and to inform public health interventions to address health inequities.

EAST GARFIELD PARK BEST BABIES ZONE (BBZ)

As part of the national BBZ initiative, SUHI co-leads the East Garfield Park BBZ with West Side partners. The initiative addresses racial disparities in infant mortality and birth outcomes through place-based, multi-sector, and community-driven approaches.

CITYWIDE COLLABORATIVES

SUHI is a leader and an engaged and active partner in several citywide projects, including West Side United, West Side ConnectED, and the Healthy Chicago Partnership. In particular, SUHI co-leads the West Side United Metrics Workgroup which established an innovative, multi-level framework to assess collective impact across the West Side.

Sinai Chicago

Sinai Chicago is one of the largest safety net providers of health care for low income patients in Illinois. Located on the West and Southwest Sides of Chicago, Sinai's service area encompasses 25% of Chicago, including many of the most economically challenged communities in the City. Sinai Chicago employs nearly 4,000 caregivers and is a major employer for the residents of the West and Southwest Sides. Its operating budget is over \$500 million a year. Over half of Sinai's patients are covered by the Medicaid program.

Sinai Chicago includes:

- Mount Sinai Hospital, a 319 licensed beds acute care and teaching hospital located in North Lawndale on the West Side of Chicago. Mount Sinai is a Level I trauma center. Mount Sinai trains more than 700 health care professionals each year including four residency programs in family medicine, internal medicine, general surgery and pharmacy as well as other residency programs in partnership with UI Health.
- Sinai Children's Hospital, a state-designated children's hospital including a Level III intensive care unit and a wide range of specialty outpatient pediatric care.

- Holy Cross Hospital, an acute care hospital located in the Marquette Park community on the Southwest Side of Chicago. In addition to being one of the busiest emergency rooms in Chicago, Holy Cross has a unique range of behavioral health services that includes Chicago's first crisis stabilization unit.
- Schwab Rehabilitation Hospital, one of three freestanding rehabilitation hospitals in Chicago with 112 licensed beds and the only one serving a high percentage of Medicaid patients. Schwab provides comprehensive inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services and provides care for patient from hospitals throughout metropolitan Chicago.
- Sinai Medical Group (SMG) a primary and specialty care medical group that includes 300 physicians, physician assistants and nurse practitioners. SMG is a major provider of specialty care for federally qualified health centers in Chicago and operates ten community based clinics.
- Sinai Community Institute (SCI) with 14 programs providing community-based health and social service program to over 14,000 families. SCI is also providing community education to encourage participation in the U.S. Census.
- Sinai Urban Health Institute (SUHI) which conducts health care disparities research, develops innovation community health innovations, delivers community health worker training and consultation, and currently has initiatives to address asthma, breast health, diabetes and violence.

As a system, Sinai Chicago annually provides:

- 21,750 inpatient admissions.
- 225,250 outpatient visits.
- 85,300 emergency room visits.
- 1,500 trauma visits including a high percentage of penetrating trauma.
- 33,000 ambulance runs.
- Over 80,000 adult and child mental health visits including a recent \$10 million investment in expanded inpatient, outpatient, and crisis stabilization services.
- 1,740 babies delivered.

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
